even half of my kingdom.'

<sup>24</sup> She went out and said to her mother, 'What should I ask for?' She replied, 'The head of John the Baptist.'

<sup>25</sup> Immediately she rushed back to the king and requested, 'I want you to

give me at once the head of John the Baptizer on a platter.'

<sup>26</sup> The king was deeply grieved; yet out of regard for his oaths and for the guests, he did not want to refuse her. <sup>27</sup> Immediately the king sent a soldier of the guard with orders to bring John's head.

He went and beheaded him in the prison, <sup>28</sup> brought his head on a platter, and gave it to the girl. Then the girl gave it to her mother.

<sup>29</sup> When his disciples heard about it, they came and took his body, and laid it in a tomb.

#### **Amos 7.7-15**

<sup>7</sup> This is what the LORD showed me:

the Lord was standing beside a wall built with a plumb-line, with a plumb-line in his hand. <sup>8</sup> And the LORD said to me, 'Amos, what do you see?' And I said, 'A plumb-line.'

Then the Lord said, 'See, I am setting a plumb-line in the midst of my people Israel; I will never again pass them by; <sup>9</sup> the high places of Isaac shall be made desolate, and the sanctuaries of Israel shall be laid waste, and I will rise against the house of Jeroboam with the sword.'

<sup>10</sup> Then Amaziah, the priest of Bethel, sent to King Jeroboam of Israel, saying, 'Amos has conspired against you in the very centre of the house of Israel; the land is not able to bear all his words. <sup>11</sup> For thus Amos has said, "Jeroboam shall die by the sword, and Israel must go into exile away from his land."'
